Post-School Outcomes

Monitors outcomes of students with disabilities one year after leaving high school. It examines whether these students are enrolled in higher education, have competitive employment, or are in some other form of education or training.

Why is it important?

Post-school outcomes data provides insight into how effectively schools prepare students with disabilities to transition to adulthood. This data can highlight gaps in services or supports that may need improvement, such as transition planning or vocational training, which is crucial for improving long-term success for students with disabilities.

What Does It Measure?


Within one year after leaving HS:

A Enrolled in higher education

B Enrolled in higher education or competitively employed

Enrolled in higher education, or some other postsecondary

education/training program; or competitively employed or in some other employment




Progress in Improving Post-School Outcomes

SPPI targets are goals set by the state to see how well schools are supporting students with disabilities. The state checks the results each year to see if these goals are being met. Indicator 14 data, as shown here, indicates steady performance in post-school outcomes that is near or exceeding targets.
